Describe your "studio":



Describe something you like about weaving and something you avoid:

I like hand manipulated patterns (love to hemstitch). I detest winding bobbins, no idea why. And this may qualify as something to avoid but it is something I have to stop doing. I am a terrible yarn hoarder! I hate to use things up. Not in the least a productive quirk! I participated in the scarf exchange a few years ago to force myself to use some hoarded tensel and I'm so glad I did.

I'm really drawn to the Scandinavian designs in weaving, so straightforward and clean and colorful. I want to try rep weave. These napkins on the loom now have an edge of rep; I got the idea from Väv magazine. I also have some hoarded Fox Fibre that I must use; my dream is to make fabric and use it to make a top, but that's a little scary. I also want to try sewing two narrow woven pieces together to make a wide piece. I tried double weave once and that was enough. I'd rather sew pieces together.
